Bachelor's studies

List of required documents:

1. Certificate of completion of secondary school
2. Transcript of grades, if it is not included in the certificate
3. Certificate confirming the knowledge of English at B2 level (IELTS 5.5-6.0, FCE, TOEFL-550, or other equivalent proof for non-natives)
4. A medical certificate stating there are no reasons for the candidate not to study.
5. Passport photo
6. Passport page copy
7. Registration fee of 50 EUR payment confirmation

All of the documents should be submitted in the form of scans with clear visibility and attached to an account created on the website

Master's studies

List of required documents:

1. Undergraduate diploma from an accredited University
2. Transcript of grades from undergraduate studies
3. Certificate confirming the knowledge of English at B2 level (IELTS 6.0, FCE, TOEFL-550, or other equivalent proof for non-natives)
4. A medical certificate stating there are no reasons for the candidate not to study.
5. Passport photo
6. Passport page copy
7. Registration fee of 50 EUR payment confirmation

Exceptions:

In addition to the above-mentioned requirements, all applicants to the Master's in English Philology program must have an excellent command of English, corresponding to the level of the Certificate of Proficiency in English (CPE) or the IELTS score of at least 8.

In addition, they must submit a research project in the field of study they wish to investigate during the M.A. program. The project should be approximately 1500 words in length and not exceed double-spaced five pages. It should consist of the following parts:

1. The formulation and justification of a research problem
2. An outline of the planned research
3. An preliminary hypothesis that follows from the initial research carried out by the candidate. The hypothesis may not be a self-evident statement or an argument that has already been examined in depth.
4. Detailed research questions that will be addressed by the applicant during the M.A. project.
5. A bibliography listing at least 10 publications.
